## **ISRI Partners with RISS**

The Institute of Scrap Recycling Industries (ISRI) has partnered with the Regional Information Sharing Systems (RISS) to make the ScrapTheftAlert.com system available through the RISS network. RISS provides investigative information sharing and intelligence support to more than 117,000 law enforcement officers in approximately 9,000 local, state, federal and tribal law enforcement agencies across the country. This agreement with RISS will expand law enforcement access to the alert system.

This partnership makes Scrap Theft readily available as a resource through a single sign-on through RISS. Once connected to Scrap Theft through RISS, users have the option of creating a password which will allow access to Scrap Theft from any internet connected computer or mobile device. Those accessing the system through RISS have been previously vetted and will have access to the alert system's private law enforcement portal. Whether connected through RISS or directly through Scrap Theft, the system will operate in the same manner as always.

This partnership strengthens the recycling industry's commitment to working with law enforcement in the fight against metals theft. Though the agreement with RISS is a major milestone in the fight, ISRI will continue to look for ways to expand the use of Scrap Theft as well as other means to work with and assist law enforcement.
