Test Your Compliance Safety Accountability (CSA) Knowledge

Q: Will violations and crashes stay with a driver who continuously jumps from company to company?

A: Yes. If the violation is determined to be one the driver was responsible for or could have prevented it will be placed in the driver's personal data as well as the carrier's. This data stays with the driver, no matter what carrier the driver is working for.

Q: Does the driver component of CSA only apply to drivers with a CDL license?

A: No. Any driver operating a commercial vehicle is subject to the CSA program. A commercial vehicle according to the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration is a vehicle used in commerce with a gross weight or a gross weight rating of more than 10,000 lbs., either single or in combination, a passenger vehicle designed to transport 16 or more passengers including the driver, and any vehicle transporting a placardable amount of hazardous materials.

Q: Will violations, citations, or warnings issued against the driver while driving his/her personal vehicle be placed into the driver's data in CSA?

A: No. The only data that will be placed into the CSA database related to drivers will be violations noted on a roadside inspection report (this is only completed when a commercial vehicle and/or the driver of a commercial vehicle is inspected) and crashes that a driver is involved in while operating a commercial vehicle.
